
homes to contemplate the re-

Overwhelmed and frightened, especially since our illusion of safety and invulnerability has been shattered. It is especially important that in our shock and anger about what has happen that we not jump to conclusions or find ourselves blaming any particular group of people. Realizing that we all are under a great deal of stress means we must reach out to others, as well as heal ourselves. Some of the normal reactions which you may experience are:

**Physical Reactions:** Fatigue, nightmares, insomnia, hyperactivity, hypersomnia, startle reactions, under activity, exhaustion headaches, stomach problems, appetite changes.

**Cognitive Reactions:** Difficulty concentrating, difficulty making decisions, difficulty solving problems, memory disturbance, inability to attach importance to anything other than the incident.

**Emotional Reactions:** Fear, anxiety, guilt, depression, emotional numbing, feelings of helplessness, over sensitivity anger, violent fantasies, irritability. These are normal reactions and although painful, are part of the natural healing process. There is very little you can do to make yourself not experience these feelings, but there are things you can do to promote a healthy response.

Things to do: Alternate periods of inactivity with exercise to help alleviate physical reactions. Take the initiative to talk with others and express your feelings. Talk to people about what you are experiencing. Structure your time: Continue your normal pattern of activities as much as possible. Remind yourself that these reactions are normal and you are not going crazy. Give yourself permission to feel depressed, overwhelmed and sad and express these feelings. Find positive ways to express your grief: give blood, write in a journal, reach out to others. Maintain good nutrition and don't numb yourself with alcohol and drugs.

## Simple Indulgence Cookie Cheesecakes

For this delicious recipe you will need:

12 chocolate cookie sandwiches (oreos will work) with white cream filling

2 8-oz packages of cream cheese, softened

1/2 cup of sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

2 eggs

Orange peel curls (optional)

Preheat oven to 325. Split each cookie, keeping filling intact one cookie half.

Line 12 2 1/2 in. muffin cups with foil bake cups. Place a cookie half with filling in each cup, filling side up. Beat cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla in a mixing bowl until smooth. Add eggs and beat on low speed just till combined. Spoon mixture into cups. Crush the remaining cookies; sprinkle some crumbs over filling. Bake 20-25 minutes or until set; tops may indent slightly. Cool. Cover and

## In The Garden with Carolyn

Ever want to know how to get free plants! Look towards your friends and neighbor...A good way to get free plants is from friends. Many plants multiply and can be divided or their "babies" can be cut off. These include calla lilies (small bulbs), iris, bergenia, hanging spider plants. Others can easily be rooted in water. Cuttings from geraniums or impatiens are the best examples. Others include fuschias and rex or "angel wing" begonias. A few drops of Vitamin B1 liquid for plants will help them root. Put your plant in a glass container. When they have several little white roots, transplant in potting soil or light, not heavy soil. I once admired a lovely Orchid Cactus (*Epiphyllum*) at a yard sale and the lady broke off some pieces. I took them home and put in a pot with potting soil and in a few months I had a lovely pink flower! Another lady at a moving sale let me take some bergenia plants (they multiply). My mother has had luck starting roses from cuttings and they bloom. I would be glad to share a cutting from my "lemon scented geranium" plant with you. It has very tiny pinkish flowers in spring. When you brush against the plant, it smells like lemon and they grow fast! Email me at cl Louise16@juno.com if you would like one. Until next time...happy growing!






