We celebrate 25 years!!!

Washington Square Neighborhood Association celebrates its twenty-fifth anniversary at the quarterly meeting at 7 pm, July 15th, 2010 to be held in the backyard of Lynn Henning's home at 1321 North Towner. Lynn has graciously allowed us to take over her large back yard for the meeting and celebration. A light dinner and beverages will be served.

A quarter of a century ago, the association was formed as a result of opposition to a then proposed sports stadium complex at the corner of Flower Street and Civic Center Drive. Major concern at the time was based primarily on the lack of information about the project readily available to residents surrounding the proposed site. Early neighborhood activists were concerned about the loss of quality of life due to the project's size, uncontrolled traffic and parking intrusion.

Sara Broadbent, Debra Welty, Susie van der Roest, and Kathy Rosenow recruited others and quickly formed the alliance of concerned residents now known as Washington Square Neighborhood Association. Its function was to disseminate information to the neighborhood about the proposed building project while lobbying City Hall for the preservation of the neighborhood.

WSNA shares the designation of being one of the oldest neighborhood associations in the city of Santa Ana with Historic French Park Neighborhood Association and Wilshire Square Neighborhood Association. Members of WSNA have actively helped other neighborhoods in the formation of their own associations by offering advice on association structure, neighborhood meetings and achieving 501(c)(3) status. It is safe to say that over the years, WSNA evolved into one of the most respected, active and best organized neighborhood associations in Santa Ana.

The internet is a fact of life now, but 25 years ago it was a different story. Today you can visit the website and you'll find upcoming and current news and events in Washington Square, as well as happenings that affect us. In addition, archived newsletters, event photo galleries and a growing collection of our history is all there and available for the clicking.

In fact, the more we improve the website and add to the content, the better the user statistics become. For June 2006 Total Pages were 7491, June 2010: 51350--Nearly seven (7!) times more pages served in the same time period during 2006. Exponential growth like that is the reward for a consistently maintained presence on the web.

Projected to annual figures, WSNA's ittle neighborhood website receives nearly 40 thousand visits per year and reaches approximately 12,450 visitors per year.

Washington Square residents and vollunteers have been effective in many of their efforts on behalf of our neighborhood. We have created lasting and positive change with huge projects like the Litter Mitigation Program (trashcans) to small things like getting out a one-page flier. I think now is a good time to recognize WSNA's accomplishments that have accumulated over the last 25 years.

- Recognition by the city of Santa Ana that Washington Square is a neighborhood worky of preservation
- Recognized by the city of Santa Ana as host neighborhood for the Arbor Day celebration.
- Litter Mitigation Program--successful fundraising, design, installation of strategically placed concrete trash cans to collect pedestrian trash
- Street Sign Upgrade and Replacement -- Successful fundraising, design, installation of all neighborhood street signs to uniform blue-based design approved and installed by city of Santa Ana.
- Painted Signpost Program--Many signposts have been painted black thereby neatening the look of the streets.
- Newsletters and Notification Flyers--Consistent communication with neighborhood via a newsletter published and delivered to homes regularly. Individual flyers are delivered to homes prior to events or important information.
- Website--recognized as a premier neighborhood website, www.Washington-Square.org, is now a keystone of WSNA's communication efforts.
- Relocation of swap meets--from Eddie West Stadium and Rancho Santiago College to areas best suited to handle the high volume of pedestrian and vehicular traffic
- Traffic mitigation--The institution of neighborhood traffic mitigation which has become a working model for other neighborhoods and the city of Santa Ana
- Community building events: Neighborhood events foster personal relationships, comraderie and provide entertainment, as well
  as occasionally provide opportunity for fundraising. WSNA's volunteers have organized many events such as Fall Concert, Wine
  Walk, Home and Garden Tour, Summer Party, Easter Egg Hunt, Holiday Party.
