NEIGHBORHOOD HERO: Susan Van der Roest



Susan Van der Roest has received the well-deserved Washington Square Neighborhood Hero award. The Com-Link celebration honoring neighborhood heroes, and more, was held at the Bowers Museum on Thursday, June 27.

A life-long resident of Santa Ana where her father served as mayor, she obtained her bachelor's degree in art at UCI. Along with her husband, Martin, they have been part of the WSNA community for more than forty years and currently live on North Towner St. They have two sons, one of whom (David) named the Kidseum!

You will see Susan, aka “the tree lady,” walking the neighborhood, identifying trees that are ill and diseased. Recently, there were branches blocking the sidewalk at 10th and Freeman, and Susan simply chopped them up. She also calls the city repeatedly until they finally respond, such as for a diseased tree on Freeman which was ultimately removed before there could be any resultant damage to homes.

For WSNA she is coordinator for the Urban Forest. She also is head of the Quality-of-Life Committee, which includes traffic and parking, overflowing trash cans and the “doggy depots.” In fact, the mail carrier delivered an exceptionally large doggy depot box when we were meeting. **Anything** that needs attention in the square, Susan will address. This is why, on her walks, Susan engages with neighbors and solicits their concerns, challenges, and issues. She believes it is important to involve neighbors and bring people together to resolve concerns.

Each year, Susan also hosts the Godinez High School Choir singing Christmas carols in her front yard. All of Washington Square is welcome, and the evening is magical.

These are just some of the examples of what makes Susan Van der Roest our WSNA 2024 Neighborhood Hero.

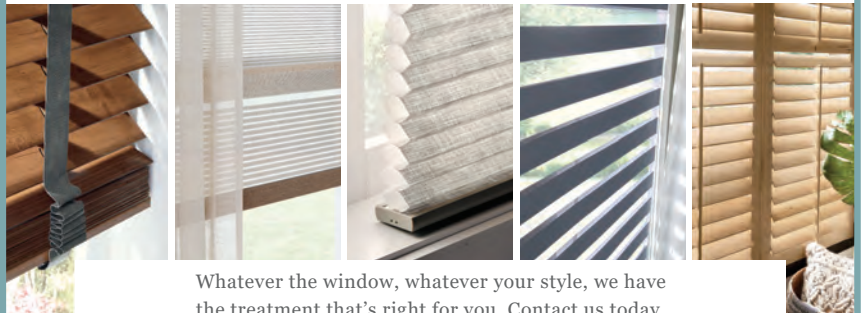

Summer is just getting started! Longer days bring out more families walking the neighborhood. Introduce yourself to those you pass by. Set up play dates for your kiddos. Get inspired by the landscapes as you walk by. The aromas of flowers are plentiful. Can you identify birds? These longer days bring about a new awakening for us, how about you?

On to business:

The last General Meeting topic of the Bristol Street Widening project brought quite a bit of concern regarding increased traffic, speeding and noise. An impromptu meeting was held with the Mayor, our Councilman, Acting City Manager, Traffic Engineering, Fire Authority, and other City officials. With construction estimated to start in the fall, we need to implement strategies now. Speed bumps, increased patrols (including SAPD on bikes), restricting left turn from southbound Bristol to Washington and other viable solutions are being discussed with Traffic Engineering. We look forward to working with the city to minimize the impact of this construction.

General Meeting:

We will have speakers from Segerstrom Center, OCTA, and Parks and Recreation Dept with an update on the 10th and Flower Park design.

Rescheduled to a Saturday in October. Details on Facebook and in the October Newsletter Coffee with the Mayor is open to all Washington Square residents. This will be your opportunity to ask the mayor and the folks at City Hall all your questions. Please treat each other and the city people respectfully. There will be space on the lawn to sit or you can bring your own chair, since there will be a limited number of chairs.

Facebook Poll:

A recent Facebook poll asked for your priorities/needs for the neighborhood and the list below was presented to Mayor Amezcua. This is your opportunity to elaborate on our list and for city officials to answer questions. Here is what was presented by level of importance:

1. Walkable park.
2. Speed bumps at strategic locations.
3. Infill trees – too many have been removed without replacing.
4. Streetlights in darkened areas of neighborhood.
5. Parking enforcement/monitoring traffic laws/turns/speeding. Proactive ticketing.
6. Illegal fireworks crackdown.
7. More businesses on Bristol.
8. Replace pork chop signs at Washington and Flower that were taken down one and a half years ago.
9. Sidewalk repairs.

Park update:

The feasibility study for our desired walkable park was incorporated in the Fiscal Year 24/25 City Budget formally approved on June 18th. We are one big step closer to our park, and will be closely watching for activity and updates.

WSNA Real Estate *REPORT*

A couple of weeks ago, someone mentioned to me that Orange County was the most expensive housing market in the country. After doing a bit of research, the Bay Area and New York are still much higher, however our home prices have surged more than 10 percent in the last year which positions OC in the **top ten** most expensive markets. One article stated the median home price in Orange County was \$1.422M in May 2024.

For those of you who are thinking of buying or selling a home soon, here is something you should know that came out of the National Association of Realtors settlement. Starting in mid-August, 2024, a home seller who uses the services of a realtor, will no longer have to compensate (pay a commission to) the buyer's agent, which has been mandatory up until now. If a buyer is using the services of a realtor, then the buyer will need to sign an agreement in which the buyer pays their agent's commission. However, a seller can still compensate the buyer's Realtor if they choose. The mechanics of all this are more complicated than this simple explanation, so I encourage you to speak to your realtor, or feel free to contact me, if you need more details. Rules in most industries continue to change, and this one will take getting accustomed to, so don't let it scare you from your dream of homeownership.

Interest rates have dropped a bit since last quarter with FHA/VA loans at 6.25% and conventional loans with 20% down payment at about 6.375%.

Bulky Item Pickup!

As a reminder, residents with curbside cart collection may schedule up to four bulky item pickups, at no charge annually. Each pickup can be up to **four** items, or **four 30-gallon bags of trash**, or **twenty 30-gallon bags of yard waste**.

Acceptable items:

- Furniture
- Appliances
- Electronics
- Trash (four 30-gallon bags)
- Yard Waste (twenty 30-gallon bags)
- (No Hazardous waste, ie: oil, paint, garden sprays, etc.)**

Items will be collected within five working days once a request is received.

We often see items left on the curb which end up sitting there for several days. If we use the below phone number, it will be hauled away properly. Items left out could be subject to a citation, so we encourage this Bulky Item Pickup Service.

Call Republic Services at 657.467.6220 to schedule a Bulky Item Pickup.

Customers who exceed the number of free pickups may receive bulky item collection for a fee.
